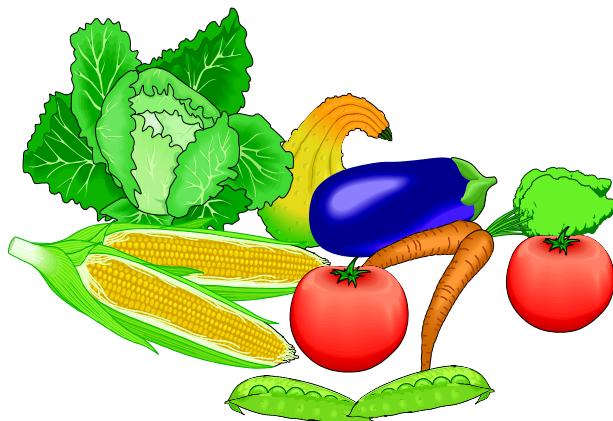

Pick-up

Entries may be picked up between 10:00 p.m.-
11:00 p.m. on Friday. Entries not picked up on
Friday will be discarded, however ribbons will be
available at the Rutgers Cooperative
Extension Office starting on Monday after the fair.



Rules

1. All entries must be grown and selected by exhibitor.
2. Each entry must consist of a correctly named single variety.
3. Exhibitor may receive only one award in each subclass or class, if it has no subclasses.
4. Exhibitor will be furnished plates and identification tags.
5. Exhibits must be in place no later than 8:00 pm Monday.
6. Vegetables will be judged on quality.
7. Ribbons will be awarded 1st through 3rd and Honorable Mention.
8. If the number of specimens in an entry is not correct according to the class list, that entry will automatically receive an Honorable Mention.
9. Entries may be picked up between 10 pm - 11 pm on Friday. Entries not picked up on Friday will be discarded; however, ribbons will be available at the Rutgers Cooperative Extension Office starting on Monday after the Fair.
